FSCA warns the public about Treasurer Investment

The Financial Sector Conduct Authority (FSCA) advises the public to exercise caution when conducting financial services business with Treasurer Investment.

The Financial Sector Conduct Authority (FSCA) received information that Treasurer Investment is conducting unauthorised financial services business via the WhatsApp platform. According to the information received, Treasurer Investment is soliciting investments from members of the public for the purpose of trading in cryptocurrency. Members of the public are encouraged to invest R150 with a promised return of R1 500 (1000% return) within a six-hour period. The FSCA points out that unrealistic returns must be viewed with great suspicion.

While the FSCA does not comment on the business activities of Treasurer Investment, the FSCA confirms that Treasurer Investment is not authorised by it to provide financial services to members of the public. The FSCA was unable to contact Treasurer Investment on the contact details available to it.

It is strongly recommended that members of the public take the following steps to verify the legitimacy of any individual or entity offering financial services:

- Confirm that the individual or entity is authorised by the Financial Sector Conduct Authority (FSCA) to provide financial products and services, including offering investment advice.
- Check the specific category of advice they are licensed to provide. In some cases, individuals or companies may be authorised to offer only basic advice on low-risk products, yet they may unlawfully provide guidance on more complex and high-risk investments.
- Ensure that the Financial Services Provider (FSP) number used by the individual or entity matches the name of the FSP listed on the FSCA's official database.

Members of the public may use one of the following methods to confirm whether a service provider or person is authorised to act as an FSP by the FSCA, including to verify their FSP number:
